Identify the Problem and Knowledge-to-Practice Gap

Step 2

Review and Select Relevant Knowledge

Step 3

Adapt the Blueprint to the Context of Interest

Step 4

Assess Barriers and Facilitators to Knowledge Uptake

Step 5

Tailor and Implement the Blueprint

Step 6

Monitor Use of the Blueprint

Step 7

Evaluate Outcomes of the Blueprint

Step 8

Sustain Use of Evidence-Based Knowledge
